Celebrating 100 Years

1922 – The Junior League of Memphis (JLM) was founded by Mrs. McKay Van Vleet.

1947 – The Speech and Hearing Center was established by JLM in cooperation with the University of Tennessee and the Shelby County Society for Disabled Adults and Crippled Children.

1955 – JLM helped to launch WKNO TV. Our volunteers debut a puppet show in support of their children’s programming efforts called “Just Before Bedtime.”

1967 – 45th Anniversary. JLM bought the 2717 Union Avenue Annex.

1971 – Party Potpourri cookbook was first published by JLM.

1981 – The Memphis Cookbook published a new cover for its 30th anniversary.

1984 – The Sustainer Council was established.

1985 – The Community Advisory Board was established in January 1985.

The Memphis Cookbook was named the official cookbook of the Memphis in May Int’l Festival.

1993-94 – Party Potpourri was inducted into the Southern Living Cookbook Hall of Fame on November 2, 1993.

2006 – JLM celebrated its 85th anniversary with a festive party at the Pink Palace Museum.

2016 – Memphis Women’s Summit was founded.

1929 – First JLM Headquarters was established at 420 Union Avenue.

1939 – The Arts & Interest Committee formed our Garden Club in 1933.

1945 – On June 21, 1945, the Junior League Thrift Shop opened at 86 Madison Ave.

1952 – The Memphis Cookbook was first published by JLM.

1956 – JLM Headquarters at 2711 Union Avenue Extended was bought.

1959 – The Youth Museum was founded by JLM, Memphis Museum and Park Commission.

1965 – The JLM Thrift Shop was moved to 203-205 Madison Avenue.

1973 – The 50th Anniversary gift to the City of Memphis was a \$100,000 pledge to the Memphis Pink Palace Museum Foundation to launch its new building and educational programs.

1983 – Good Abode was first published by JLM. The highly acclaimed illustrated history book of Memphis received the Shelby County Historical Commission Award.

1987 – The JLM Mother’s Day Out Project was started at St. John’s Episcopal Church.

1991 – JLM moved to Community Resource Center and celebrated this new community service with a grand opening.

1992 – Heart & Soul Cookbook published and presented to the community during a festive evening at Graceland.

1994-95 – The JLM built its first Habitat House.

1999 – A Sterling Collection, best of the best cookbook published. Repeat Boutique, the new JLM thrift shop, opened on 3586 Summer Avenue.

2009 – G.R.O.W. Thursday Night Supper Club and G.R.O.W. Brewster were founded.

2022 – JLM celebrated its Centennial anniversary.

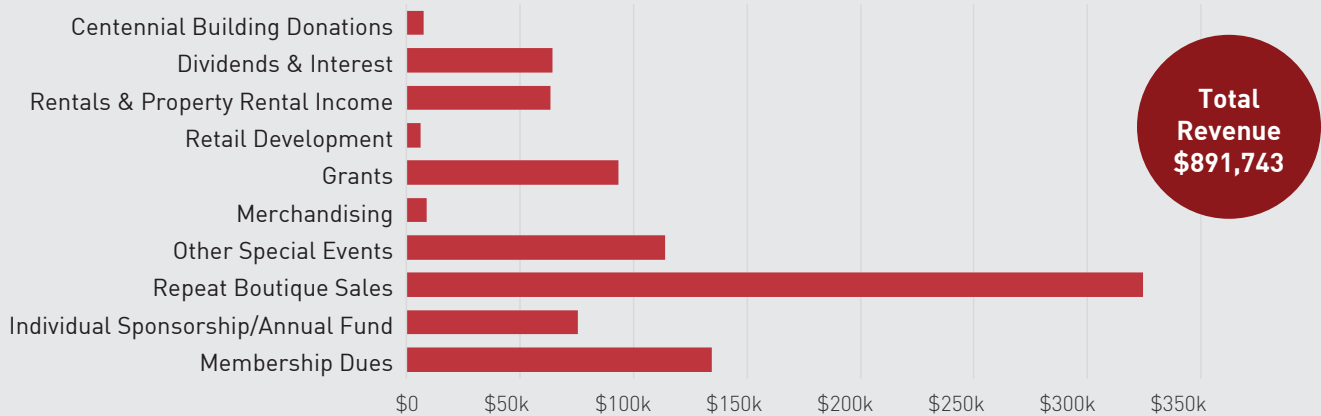

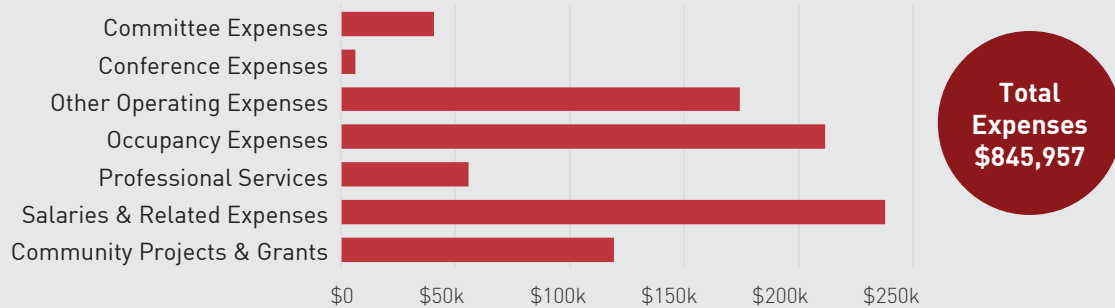

FOOD DRIVE

The COVID-19 pandemic amplified food insecurity in our community, and the Junior League of Memphis stepped in to answer the call. Food insecurity can drive families to make difficult trade-offs between necessities. Through a \$50,000 grant the JLM hosted bi-monthly mobile food pantries at the Lester Street Community Center from August 2021-April 2022. Diapers and hygiene products were also distributed through a partnership with Sweet Cheeks Diaper Ministries.
